Life Space Crisis Intervention (LSCI)

35 Contact Hours / 4.5 CEUs

May 10-June 25 (Online); June 28-29 (On-Site), Richmond

Cost: \$595

November 2-December 17 (Online); December 20-21 (On-Site), Richmond

LSCI is taught in an online/on-site format and teaches therapeutic skills for dealing with troubled children. Traditional conflict management relies on de-escalation, restraint, and exclusion. Participants will learn fresh alternatives to punitive and coercive approaches. The online learning is completed over a 7-week period and covers the foundational skills and theory of LSCI. Participants are required to read assigned materials and submit written answers to discussion questions. The online part of the class is completed by the written exam. Passing the exam is required for participation in the on-site part of the course. The on-site learning is completed over two-days where the participants will view the LSCI interventions and practice the six reclaiming interventions. The second day will include a practical exam of the participants' skills. For an additional fee, three semester hours of graduate credit are available through Augustana College, Sioux Falls, S.D.; CEUs available through VCU School of Social Work.
